## **INTERNATIONAL YOUTH CLIMATE FORUM 2010**

#### 1. BACKGROUND

Environment and development have been in the agenda of UN, government, faith communities and NGOs since early 80's but in the beginning of 21st century, the Climate change has emerged as a new challenge and become an integral priority concern of various stake holders. Modernization, rapid development policies have great impact on environment and climate. Natural resource management has direct relevance to poverty, sustainable development and peace. Poorest of the poor can feel the impact in terms water crises, excessive heat waves toward marine and coastal preservation for sustainable food stock.

Climate change is taking place due to human activities, and will have significant social, economic and environmental consequences. These consequences will be unevenly distributed across geographical, social and generational boundaries, and will increase global inequality.

Addressing climate change is the challenge for young generation, and requires the action and cooperation of people from all faiths, cultures, and countries. Young people have a responsibility to take care of the earth and commit themselves to working towards justice and sustainable future. To build awareness about the impacts of climate change and enhance their capacity to engage in green campaign (positive actions inspired by religious and cultural values to protect environment and climate) at schools and communities. To encourage participants get involved in dealing with climate change and in the process of green development, strengthen and improve cooperation and mutual interest amongst participants.

International Youth Climate forum 2010 will empower participants through lecturing, Workshop, Islands and Forest Expedition, NGO and Youth Organization Exhibition, Plenarry Session, Public Youth Dialogue, Panel Discussion, Focus Group Discussion, Green Campign and Clean Up The World, Cultural Performance, Inner Reflection, Sharing Personal Experiences, Field Trip. Participants will gain knowledge and be inspired to be engaged in awareness building and best practices at school and community levels, develop new ideas and solutions for dealing with the adverse effects of climate change on human society. Participants could formulate some recommendations (Youth Statement for Action) that can strengthen youth network on climate change action, Increase participation of youth in the movements of protecting environment and climate for sustainable development and peace, build youth network on climate change action and finally Initiate 5 (five) projects ideas.

## 3. VENUES FOR INTERNATIONAL YOUTH CLIMATE FORUM 2010

October 23<sup>rd</sup> – 28<sup>th</sup>, 2010

Bengo-Bengo forest is situated in Cenrana District of Maros Regence, South Sulawesi. The Forest is pine forest in 1300 Ha that preserved by Hasanuddin University as Education tropical forest with some spices of animals lived in the forest such as white monkey, ancient butterfly, etc.

Takabonerate national park is located in the west part of Selayar Regence of South Sulawesi which consists of small islands such as Rajuni Island and Tinabo Island as the main island. The island is the third biggest of coral reef in the Coral Triangle of the world with abandon of fishes, species of coral reefs and sea grass. The large of the islands is aproximately 220.000 hectare and 500 km² of coral reefs lines.

#### 4. REGISTRATION OF PARTICIPANTS

#### 7. TRANSPORTATION

The Organizer will provide transport from Sultan Hasanuddin International Airport in Makassar to/from the venue only on 22<sup>nd</sup> October and 29<sup>th</sup> October 2010, and local transport. Participants will be escorted by local organizers and facilitators to ensure their safety, and they are kindly requested to be punctual in order to facilitate program arrangements.

## 8. SECURITY

Throughout the program on  $22^{rd} - 29^{th}$  October, 2010, security plan will be operated at all venues by the National Police Office. The Organizer has given high priority to security to ensure the safety of all participants while in Forum. Participants will be supervised at all time by government officials, facilitators and staff of the Organizer. Participants are requested to wear the identification badge given by the Organizer at all the times.

## 9. MEDICAL SERVICES

The Organizer will make every effort to ensure all participants in good health during their stay in Bandung. Hygienic food and clean water will be provided for all meals. Participants requiring special meals .i.e. vegetarian food should inform the Organizer in advance. All foods are Halal food. Participants should bring their own medicine, if requested, and inform the Organizer of any special medical needs. While general medical services will be provided by the Provincial Government of South Sulawesi, it is strongly advised that participants make their own arrangements for medical insurance to cover dental, surgical and hospital expenses in case of accident or emergency situations.

## 10. DRESS CODE

Due to warm weather in the day while cold at night and sometimes rain in South Sulawesi, participants are recommended to bring light clothing and sweater. Upon arrival, participants will obtain one complimentary bag with basic stationary. Participants are responsible for their own toiletries and personal health care items. ## 12. GENERAL INFORMATION

#### a. South Sulawesi in Brief

South Sulawesi is situated at the South of Celebes. Makassar is the main city and there are several districts of natural world heritage such as Takabonerate Island and Bulu Saraung National Park in Selayar and Maros Regence.

## Language

Official language is Bahasa Indonesia. English is limited used and understood particularly in the City of Makassar, in business and public sector.

#### Weather

South Sulawesi is well known has very good weather between 23-28 degrees.

#### b. Telecommunication

Indonesia has extensive, modern and cheapest telecommunication fees in the region. International roaming for certain mobile phone service providers is also available in the city of Makassar. Indonesian currency is Rupiah. Notes are issued in denominations of 1000, 5000, 10,000, 20,000, 50,000 and 100,000. Coins are issued in 100, 200, and 500. Participants will easily find money-changer, while major credit cards are widely accepted throughout the City of Makassar.

## d. Electricity Supply

Power supply is 2200 volts. Two-hole socket is standard power supply. Participants should bring appropriate adapter for their own electrical appliance.
